ATTENDANCE FOCUS



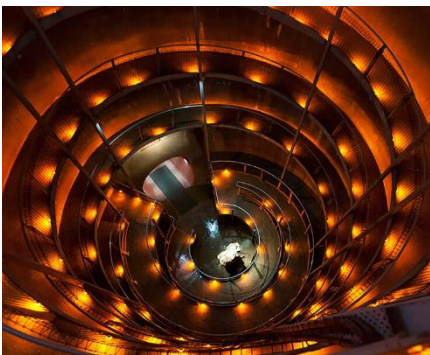
We are very focused on ensuring that all our tamariki are at school regularly. We know from studies and our own experiences that attendance and success at Kura are linked.

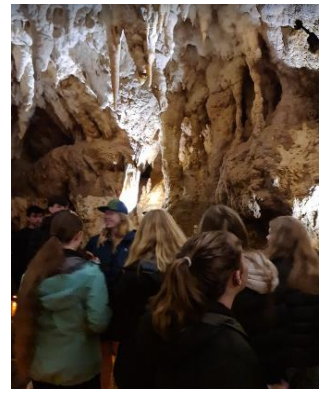
Please also be aware that there are specific rules around absences and NCEA assessments. If the absence occurs on the day of the assessment please contact the subject teacher or HOD that morning.

ENROLMENT SCHEME FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The board invites applications from caregivers who wish to enrol their children at Rotorua Lakes High School for next year.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

Enrolment forms are available at the school office or online at www.rotorualakes.school.nz. Parents of students who live within the home zone should apply by **Friday 17 November 2023** to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

The board has determined that 70 places are likely to be available for out-of-zone students next year. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

For the 2024 school year, there will be four enrolment periods. The first enrolment period runs from **Monday 14 August to Friday 22 September 2023**.

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is **Friday 22 September 2023**.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held on **Tuesday 17 October 2023**. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Details relating to the second enrolment period are as follows:

- Length of enrolment period: from **Friday 20 October 2023 – Friday 17 November 2023**
- Deadline for receipt of applications: **Friday 17 November 2023**
- Date of ballot: **Wednesday 22 November 2023**

Details relating to the third enrolment period are as follows:

- Length of enrolment period: from **Friday 24 November 2023– Friday 19 January 2024**
- Deadline for receipt of applications: **Friday 19 January 2024**
- Date of ballot: **Wednesday 24 January 2024**

A final ballot will be held if required and if space available for any applications received by **Friday 23 February 2024**.

No out of zone enrolments for the 2024 school year will be accepted after this date.

GREAT HOCKEY

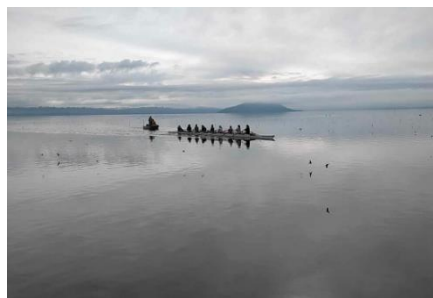

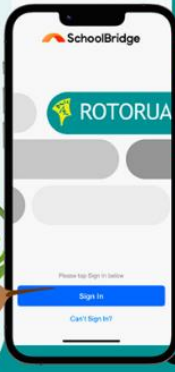
